THE PROGRAM
Winning is an attitude that permeates the entire University of Oklahoma athletics program. Championships and postseason play are synonymous with practically every Sooner sport. Over the last 15 years, no OU program has accomplished more than softball. The architect - head coach Patty Gasso - needed just five years before she took her team to the pinnacle of the sport. And OU has not dropped from elite territory since. Gasso and company have created a tradition that rivals nearly any program in college softball and it has only taken 14 years. During that span, OU has averaged nearly 50 wins a season and won - on average - 70 percent of its contests. It is no wonder the Sooners have risen to national prominence so quickly.





2009 Big 12 Champions

THE ARCHITECT

Marita Hynes took a major risk when she chose Patty Gasso to lead the softball program in 1995. Gasso was a successful junior college coach at Long Beach City College without any ties to the Midwest, let alone Oklahoma. Gasso jumped at the opportunity and immediately began attracting top athletes from each coast and everywhere in between. Players like Kansas native Lisa Carey and California native Heather Scaglione were given the chance to shine in the Sooner spotlight and are perfect examples of players from different backgrounds who have become some of the biggest names in the sport.



THE DEFINING MOMENT

The program's defining moment came in its first trip to the Women's College World Series in 2000. The Sooners came away victorious. Since then, they have made appearances in five of the last 10 WCWS and have become one of the most recognizable teams in the sport.

FIVE WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES APPEARANCES

The numbers tell the story of the Oklahoma softball program's dramatic rise into elite company. The Sooners have made trips to the Women's College World Series in five of the last nine years. No other team east of Pac-10 country had ever been to five consecutive WCWS until the Sooners did it. OU qualified for the national championship tournament by winning five straight NCAA Regional Championships. During that run to five consecutive WCWS, no team has been more efficient in its efforts. Patty Gasso's troops have gone 31-9 in regionals over the last 10 seasons. Since head coach Patty Gasso stepped onto campus in 1995, the Sooners have won three Big 12 Postseason Championships, eight NCAA Regional Championships and qualified for five WCWS.

That is a run that is unparalleled by any program east of Arizona and one that can only be matched by a few out west.



OU KNOCKS OFF UCLA TO WIN NATIONAL TITLE

The Sooners swept through their home regional as they defeated Harvard, Cal State-Northridge and beat Oregon State twice to make their first ever appearance in the World Series. The Sooner magic continued in Oklahoma City as Oklahoma opened the series with a 2-1 win over California and knocked off Southern Mississippi and perennial powerhouse Arizona to advance to the title game against UCLA. Using a 3-1 win over the Bruins, OU claimed its first national title in program history.

OKLAHOMA MAKES IT TWO STRAIGHT

A year after winning the national title and becoming only the second non-west coast team to win a softball national championship, the Sooners were back in the title hunt again. Once again, OU swept through its home regional after beating Lehigh, North Carolina and No. 12 Washington (twice) to advance to its second straight WCWS. The Sooners carried the nation's longest winning streak into the World Series, but went 1-2 and were eliminated by LSU in a heartbreaking 2-1 game.

SOONERS KNOCK OFF TOP-SEED TEXAS

The Sooners faced a tough task as they hosted the top-seeded Texas Longhorns in the Norman Regional. Oklahoma opened the regional with victories over Utah and Texas A&M before facing Texas and Olympic pitcher Cat Osterman. The Sooners avenged a loss to the Longhorns in the Big 12 Tournament as they scored four runs and advanced to the regional finals with a 4-1 win. Texas A&M knocked off Texas again and OU topped the Aggies 4-1 in the final to advance to its third straight WCWS.

OU TAKES REGIONAL, MAKES IT FOUR STRAIGHT

Different from their first three WCWS appearances, the Sooners had to do it on the road as they were sent to Gainesville, Fla., for the NCAA Regional. It didn't phase the Sooners as OU swept through the regional with the closest margin of victory being four runs. Oklahoma knocked off Bethune Cookman, South Florida, Texas-Arlington and Oregon State on its way to its fourth consecutive Women's College World Series appearance.

SOONERS ADVANCE TO ANOTHER WCWS

OU faced another daunting task when it learned of its NCAA Regional schedule as it was headed to No. 1 Arizona as the No. 2 seed in the toughest regional in the tournament. Oklahoma faced the No. 1 Wildcats in the winner's bracket and upset Arizona, 3-2. The top-ranked Wildcats were knocked out by Louisiana-Lafayette in the loser's bracket final. The Cajuns, who had to beat the Sooners twice, topped OU in the first game but Oklahoma responded with a 15-0 run rule to advance to its fifth WCWS.

2000 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

The University of Oklahoma earned its first-ever softball national championship by defeating UCLA, 3-1, in front 8,049 at Don E. Porter Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City on May 29, 2000. The title was the first by a women's athletic program at Oklahoma. The Sooners finished the season with the best record in the country at 66-8. Oklahoma, the third seed in the WCWS, got on the scoreboard in the third inning with a two-run home run from All-American first baseman Lisa Carey. Freshman shortstop Kelli Braitsch then nailed an RBI single to left field later in the inning to give OU the 3-0 lead. Jennifer Stewart earned the World Series Most Outstanding Player award, earning victories in all four of OU's WCWS wins. Carey and Braitsch joined Stewart on the all-tournament team. OU became just the second non-west coast team to win a softball national championship.



THE SHOT HEARD 'ROUND OKLAHOMA

OU All-American Lisa Carey's two-run home run in the 2000 National Championship game instantly became the program's greatest individual moment. The blast gave the Sooners the decisive 3-1 lead and eventually sealed the program's first national championship. It was the second homer in as many days for the junior as her solo shot versus Arizona in the semifinals lifted the Sooners to the title game. The blast was Carey's 20th of the year.




BIG 12 YEAR-BY-YEAR

OU head coach Patty Gasso came on board in 1995 and one year later the Big 12 was born. Since season one, the Sooners have proved to be the class of the conference. They won the first regular season title, they were the first to 50 wins and the first to 100 wins. It's no wonder they lead the conference in all-time winning percentage.


BEDLAM BELL

The Sooners' work in the Bedlam series is even more impressive. Since the official start of The Bedlam Series (2001), the trophy hasn't left Norman. OU has won it outright seven of the eight years and retained it after a split in 2003. Since the start of Big 12 play, OU has done no worse than a split with Oklahoma State in the regular season series, while claiming the series in 12 of 14 years.

BIG 12 DOMINANCE

No Big 12 softball member has seen that spotlight shine more brightly in its direction than the Oklahoma program. The Sooners have been on the national stage for the Women's College World Series in five of the last 10 years. No Big 12 team has made more appearances at the WCWS since the inception of the conference in 1996. In fact, Nebraska and Texas are the only other teams to make more than one trip to the WCWS during that time frame. OU has more NFCA All-Americans than the rest of the conference. The nation's coaches have voted 31 Sooners onto the NFCA's All-America teams since the inception of the Big 12. Only three other teams - Nebraska, Texas and Texas A&M - can claim to have double-digit All-Americans during the era. The Sooners lead the pack in All-Big 12 first team selections (57) and all-time winning percentage (.753).


FIRST NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR FINALIST

Ricketts, who led the nation in RBI during the regular season, joined Arizona State's Kaitlin Cochran and Tennessee's Monica Abbott (the winner) as one of three finalists.

GETTING RECOGNITION

With team accomplishments comes individual recognition. That adage has held true with the Oklahoma softball program, which has raked in just about every honor out there.

Start with the coaching staff. OU head coach Patty Gasso, the architect of the Sooners' move to the top of the softball world, has been named the Big 12 Coach of the Year three times - 1996, 1999, 2000. Gasso and her staff were named Speedline/NFCA Division I National Coaching Staff of the Year in 2000 after claiming the National Championship. The OU coaching staff has also garnered the NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year award on five occasions - 1996, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2004.

OU players have accumulated more honors than any other conference member. The list starts with All-Americans, of which OU has 33. At the regional level, 76 players have landed on the team. Among the Big 12 ranks, 57 Sooners have notched first team conference awards. Add in a National Player of the Year finalist, six Big 12 Players of the Year, two Freshman of the Year honorees, two Defensive Players of the Year, one Newcomer of the Year, one Pitcher of the Year, 46 Players of the Week and 25 Pitchers of the Week and the list becomes overwhelming.

The softball program has always produced well-rounded athletes and the academic honors don't take a back seat. In 2000, Lana Moran became the first Sooner in any sport to garner the Academic All-American of the Year. Seven student-athletes have been named Academic All-Americans. Ten have earned Academic All-District recognition. A total of 36 were named Academic All-Big Eight and 65 have already earned Academic All-Big 12 acclaim.

DEFINITION OF A STUDENT-ATHLETE

Oklahoma pitcher Lana Moran took the term student-athlete to new heights with her 2000 Academic All-American of the Year recognition. The lone senior on the 2000 National Championship team, Moran captained the squad as she tallied a 26-2 mark with five shutouts in the circle. Moran's biggest achievement came in the classroom where the San Bernardino, Calif., native compiled a 3.88 GPA in sociology. Moran was a two-time GTE first team Academic All-American, a four-time Academic All-Big 12 selection and the first Sooner in any sport to be named the Academic All-American of the Year.

The phone in Oklahoma head coach Patty Gasso's office rang three different times. Each time, the USA Elite team selection committee was on the other end. Each time they wanted Gasso to gauge the interest one of her players would have in playing for the 2004 Elite team.

After the third call, Gasso sat in her office and pondered what had happened over the last month. During that span, three Sooners had been invited (and accepted) to play in the First World University Softball Championships as members of the USA Elite team, which ranks only behind the Olympic team. Three Sooners were on the 16-player team, which was a first for any team at OU and only the fourth time any softball program had placed that many players on the squad at the same time.

It was just another sign that OU was among collegiate softball's creme de la creme but it still took some time to hit Gasso.

USA Softball's interest in the Oklahoma program continued during the summer of 2006 as alum Norrelle Dickson was one of 16 collegiate players to play on the USA World Team in Taiwan. Sooner players have been called on before. Former Sooners Kami Keiter and Heather Scaglione were rookies on the 2004 squad. Dickson, on the other hand, played in five tournaments with the Elite squad. Former Sooner Kristin Vesely played for the USA Junior National Team before her freshman year and alum Leah Gulla (2000-03) was part of the Olympic Trials. Additionally, Samantha Ricketts, as well as alums Christina Enea, Kelli Braitsch and Lisa Carey have received a number of tryouts.

Sooner softball has carved its niche into USA Softball and Gasso should be ready for future calls.

SOONERS IN THE PROS


The Sooners have watched numerous alums graduate to the professional ranks. As far back as Jill Most, Jennifer Jaime and Lynnette Velasquez, OU has made an impact on the highest stage of softball.

During the inaugural National Pro Fastpitch college draft, three former Sooners were selected. Erin Evans made the most of her opportunity as a member of the Houston Thunder. Leah Gulla and Christy Ring were also drafted by Colorado in the first NPF draft.

Most recently, Samantha Ricketts was selected by the Akron Racers. Norelle Dickson was picked as the sixth overall pick by the Akron Racers and was named an all-NPF selection in her first season with the team. Kristin Vesely was the fourth overall pick in the 2006 NPF draft and led the New England Riptide to the NPF title in her first season. In 2005, Oklahoma led all programs with three draftees in the 2005 NPF Senior Draft as Heather Scaglione was the first catcher selected and Kami Keiter (11th) and Christina Enea (13th) were also drafted.

MEDIA ATTENTION - PUBLIC AND SOCIAL

The Women's College World Series has been the biggest event in Oklahoma over the last few years. The Oklahoma softball team capitalized on that exposure by winning in its first trip to the WCWS in 2000.

Patty Gasso's squad enjoys more coverage than arguably any program in the country. The unique media landscape in Oklahoma has something to do with that. Five straight WCWS trips has been a bigger influence. Perhaps nothing better illustrates the softball program's rise than a June 2004, story in the largest paper in the state, *The Oklahoman*. Columnist Jenni Carlson boldly proclaimed head coach Patty Gasso as the best coach at the University. Carlson ranked Gasso's achievements above those of football coach Bob Stoops, basketball coach Sherri Coale and gymnastics coach Mark Williams. One opinion sparked argument throughout the state. Gasso couldn't buy publicity that good. But she and her teams have certainly earned it.

The Sooners are represented on the social media front. The University of Oklahoma Athletics Department has official pages on Facebook, Twitter and YouTube. The softball program utilizes all three to provide fans with a behind-the-scenes look at the program. Seniors Amber Flores (@ou_amberflores) and Lindsey Vandever (@ou_linzvandever) "tweet" throughout the season in addition to the team's account (@SoonerSoftball).

BUILT ON, top-notch facilities



THE COMPLEX

Marita Hynes Field at the OU Softball Complex has been one of the sparkling gems of the sport since it opened its doors in 1998. OU was one of the first schools outside of the Pac 10 to make the commitment to its softball program by building an exclusive facility for the sport. The trend caught on and Oklahoma was again leading the pack in women's athletics as new stadiums have sprung up across the national landscape. The OU Softball Complex uses a synthetic waterproof dirt on the infield and warning track, which allows Patty Gasso's team to train on the field minutes after a rain storm has moved through. The most recent addition to the facility was a 6,020-square-foot indoor facility opened in January 2009. The indoor facility features a 65' x 65' infield with Hilltopper infield dirt and storage for the team and grounds crew. The infield also accommodates four hitting lanes.

The complex provides permanent chair back and bleacher seating with a capacity of 1,000; a concessions building and rest rooms; press box; VIP lounge and a ticket office. The complex is equipped with a state-of-the-art underground drainage system, sprinkler system and batting cages. A paved parking lot was in place in time for the 1999 season and OU added the Robert E. Young & Family Softball Locker Room in 2002. The field was named for former softball coach and senior woman administrator, Marita Hynes, in 2004.



It's a tough task to find a single individual who has had more effect on the collegiate sport of softball and its rise in popularity than Marita Hynes. The longtime former senior woman administrator for Oklahoma actually served as the program's second softball coach. When she retired from coaching to begin a career as an administrator, she remained active in the softball world. She spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build the OU Softball Complex and oversaw its construction. During those years, she helped lure the Women's College World Series to Oklahoma City. For all her contributions to OU and beyond, the athletics department officially christened the playing surface as Marita Hynes Field on April 24, 2004.



THE PROGRAM

Oklahoma's weight training program is a pioneer in the development of strength and conditioning, and is a vital part of the Sooners' traditional success. OU strength and conditioning coaches utilize their expertise along with a wide array of equipment and tests to produce national championship-caliber athletes.

Evaluation, goal-oriented programs, supervision and state-of-the-art facilities help Oklahoma athletes become bigger, faster, stronger and more flexible. The Robin Siegfried & Family Strength and Conditioning Complex, located in the Barry Switzer Center, has 13,000 square feet to facilitate the intensive training of OU athletes.

The objective of the strength and conditioning program is to ensure each student-athlete in every sport is provided with a sound in-season and off-season program. This program of activity includes strength, conditioning, flexibility and nutrition. A strength and conditioning coordinator for each sport is provided to assist athletes in reaching the highest possible training levels.

Located at the south end of Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, the Barry Switzer Center houses administrative offices, the football locker room, the equipment room, the 8,000-square-foot Henry Freede Sports Medicine Facility and the 7,000-square-foot Touchdown Club Legends Lobby in addition to the Siegfried Strength and Conditioning Complex.

THE TRIATHLON

Before the start of the fall season, the OU softball team tackles one of its toughest strength and conditioning tests of the year - the annual triathlon. The event features a three mile run, a six-mile bike ride and a swim. The mental test is designed to push the student-athletes to finish and overcome challenges. An overall winner is named, as well as second and third-place finishers. Each event also has a winner. The event is considered the first step on the ladder of the team's ultimate goal - a national championship.



STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING COACH NANCY DERRICK

Nancy Derrick begins her first season as the strength and conditioning coach for the University of Oklahoma softball team. Derrick comes to OU from the University of Louisiana-Monroe where she was an assistant strength coach from 2006-08. While completing her degree requirements at her alma mater, Derrick was a graduate assistant strength coach at Auburn from 2004-06.

Derrick holds certifications from the Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Coaches Association and the National Strength and Conditioning Association. Derrick received her bachelor of science in health promotion in 2004. In 2006, she earned her master's degree in exercise physiology from AU. The Johnston, S.C., native was a member of the Auburn women's basketball team for four years.



COMPREHENSIVE REHABILITATION

Oklahoma feels a strong responsibility to help its athletes reach and maintain their optimum health and achieve conditioning goals. For this reason, OU has developed excellent training and conditioning programs to lessen the possibility of injuries. However, should injuries occur, the department is committed to a comprehensive rehabilitation program. Complete athletically-related medical services are provided to Oklahoma student-athletes by team physicians and OU's certified athletic trainers. The University of Oklahoma obtains the services of the best medical consultants available.

The base of operation for the Sooners' medical care is the state-of-the-art Henry J. Freede, M.D. Sports Medicine Center in the Barry Switzer Center. The addition to the Barry Switzer Center has allowed the university to upgrade to a new edition of rehabilitation equipment that can best benefit the student-athletes. From simple therabands to taping tables, the new facility offers everything a school can have or hope to have. The Sooner training room is equipped to perform isokinetic joint evaluation for preventive medicine and for post-injury rehabilitation. The therapy room is supplied with the latest modalities on the market.

A total team effort is the key to OU's efficiency in preventing, treating and rehabilitating injuries sustained by student-athletes. These measures keep Sooner athletes at their highest level of performance as they compete for championships.

"Sports medicine is a team effort," said OU head trainer Scott Anderson. "The stated goal of athletic training at Oklahoma is, first of all, care for the student-athletes, thereby granting our sports a competitive advantage and ultimately greater esteem for the entire program. To that end, we are blessed with a full complement of self-sacrificing medical professionals working on a regular basis with our athletic training staff."



ATHLETIC TRAINER JACE COBB

Jace Cobb, ATC/LAT, is in his first season as the graduate athletic trainer for the University of Oklahoma softball team. Prior to coming to Norman, Cobb was a student trainer at his alma mater, LSU. He worked with the Tiger football, men's basketball and softball teams for three seasons. During the summer of 2006, Cobb was an intern athletic trainer with the Chicago Bears organization.

The Pass Christian, Miss., native holds a bachelor's degree in kinesiology with a concentration in athletic training. Cobb is currently working towards his master's degree in human relations from OU.



"After having shoulder surgery my sophomore year, the entire training staff was a big part of me being able to get back on the field. Nearly every day after my surgery I spent time in the training room rehabilitating my shoulder with our trainers. They did everything they could think of to get me back as soon as possible. I struggled some after surgery for the rest of my career, and by my senior year Jace, Dr. Pasque and Jim Hillis were working with me pretty much every day to find ways I could pitch. Without them, there is no way I would have been able to make it through my senior season. Anything I needed, they found a way to help me, and they went above and beyond in making sure I was ready to go on gameday."


FLAGSHIP EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION

Created by the Oklahoma Territorial Legislature in 1890, the University of Oklahoma is a doctoral degree-granting research university serving the educational, cultural, economic and health care needs of the state, region and nation.

OU enrolls more than 30,000 students, has more than 2,400 full-time faculty members, and has 20 colleges offering 158 majors at the baccalaureate level, 167 majors at the master's level, 81 majors at the doctoral level, 26 majors at the doctoral professional level, and 24 graduate certificates. The university's annual operating budget is \$1.48 billion.






NORMAN - HOME OF THE SOONERS

A NEW BEGINNING

YOUNG SOONERS LOOK TO SET NEW STANDARD IN 2010

Oklahoma enters the 2010 season as defending Big 12 champions and head coach **Patty Gasso** hopes the trend continues. Another tough schedule awaits the Sooners as Oklahoma faces 21 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

"As usual, we have another very demanding schedule. We wouldn't have it any other way," said Gasso. "We will be road tested early as we open our season against two of the nation's top teams in Michigan and Tennessee. Our schedule only gets more challenging with five Pac-10 teams, but it's our belief that a tough road schedule makes for a tough team. We enjoy those opportunities. Our fans will be treated to some exciting Big 12 home games. This team is anxious to get the season started."

The Sooners return 12 letterwinners from 2009 and welcome five newcomers. OU returns an efficient offensive lineup from top to bottom and a sound defense core. Among those returning are the 2009 Big 12 Player of the Year and six all-Big 12 selections from a year ago.

"Consistency is something we're going to strive for this year," said Gasso. "We need consistency as a team and individually. I should be saying that a concern is this freshman class and how they will adjust to the collegiate level, but that is not an issue. They are a very seasoned and mature group."

An area where Oklahoma returns youthful experience is at pitching. With a pair of sophomores and two freshmen, the Sooners are laying a foundation for years to come.

"We're all excited about the depth we have at the position," Gasso said. "The amount of innings Kirsten (Allen) and Allee (Allen) were able to get last year should factor into their success this year. They threw some big games for us. Keilani (Ricketts) is going to be very special. She's learned a lot this fall. Michelle (Gascoigne) is really going to surprise some people. She had a fantastic fall."

The Sooner lineup is full of viable options for Gasso and her staff. Oklahoma returns 89.3 percent of its runs from a year ago and 85 percent of hits accumulated during 2009. While the leadoff spot is expected to be occupied by a placement hitter, most of the other positions look to be occupied by power hitters. For OU, the 2010 lineup could easily be a multiple choice question where every answer is the right one. Needless to say, it is a good problem to have.

"Jessica (Shults), Amber (Flores), Lindsey (Vandever) are all going to be in the heart of the lineup, scoring and bringing in runs," Gasso added. "Keilani has amazing power. Haley (Nix) has quick hands and a beautiful swing. With this lineup, a great hitter like Katie Norris may be hitting towards the bottom. This lineup is packed top to bottom."

After gaining valuable experience a year ago, **Allee Allen** and **Kirsten Allen** return as veteran sophomores in 2010. While Allee Allen returns following off-season shoulder surgery, Kirsten Allen looks to improve following an excellent fall season. With All-American D.J. Mathis out of the lineup for almost a month in 2009, the Sooners relied heavily on the Allens to carry the team during the span. Allee Allen went 14-4, while Kirsten Allen posted a 9-8 mark. The two combined for 232.2 innings pitched, 61.4 percent of Oklahoma's 378.1 innings pitched. Strikingly different, the duo provides an unusual combination to the battery. Allee Allen is one of three left-handed pitchers on the 2010 team, while Kirsten Allen is the only righty on the staff.

Michelle Gascoigne comes to Oklahoma after being named the *Vallejo Times Herald* Female Athlete and Softball Player of the Year in 2009. The Benicia (Calif.) High School product ended her high school career with 1,026 strikeouts, 13 career no-hitters and 52 career shutouts.

One of the most anticipated arrivals at Oklahoma is freshman **Keilani Ricketts**. The sister of former Oklahoma All-American Samantha Ricketts, the younger Ricketts packs

Team captain **Lindsey Vandever** anchors the Oklahoma battery for the 2010 a season. An All-Big 12 second team honoree in 2009, Vandever brings a solid bat and equally solid defense to the squad. Vandever hit .302 as a junior and drove in 48 runs. Her 28 walks drawn and nine home runs were career best and she was third on the team with five sacrifice hits. Defensively, Vandever caught all 57 games of the 2009 campaign. She recorded a .995 fielding percentage behind the plate, caught 15 runners stealing and picked off five.

Newcomer **Jessica Shults** not only brings experience behind the plate she owns a powerful swing. Already one of the most feared hitters in the nation, **Amber Flores** is destined to become the Oklahoma career leader in a majority of offensive categories. The 2009 Big 12 Player of the Year is already the owner of the career walks drawn record (120), and when she gets the chance to swing, her numbers are astounding. Through three seasons, Flores has managed to produce program bests in slugging and on-base percentage and ranks second in batting average. She needs just seven home runs to tie the mark that Samantha Ricketts set a year ago and is within striking distance of even more records.

After playing the majority of 2009 at third base, **Dani Dobbs** made significant strides in her first season as a starter. Dobbs set a single season record for fielding percentage by a third baseman (.982) and recorded her first two career home runs. Hitting in the bottom of the lineup, Dobbs was a national leader in reaching base after being hit by a pitch. She and Flores led the way with 19 each.

After a defensive shuffle gave her an opportunity to prove her ability at shortstop, **Karolyne Long** made the most of it. Long followed in the footsteps of her All-American sister, Savannah, after taking over at shortstop on April 1 in the second game of a doubleheader against Baylor. Long earned All-Big 12 Championship honors after leading OU past Texas in the semifinals. She also came through with a game-winning solo home run against Northwestern on March 7.



As she begins her 16th season at the University of Oklahoma, head coach Patty Gasso has molded the OU softball program into a national power and permanently placed herself among the elite college softball coaches in the country.

The Sooners have reached the Women's College World Series five times during her tenure, in the process, advanced to the postseason in each of her previous 15 seasons. The WCWS run began in 2000 when her team won the NCAA National Championship in OU's first appearance.

Is she the best coach in the history of Oklahoma softball? Undoubtedly.

Is she the greatest coach in Big 12 history? The stats say she is.

Could she be one of the best coaches to ever coach college softball? Each season, she continues to build what is a very strong argument.

Currently in her 20th season as a head coach, Gasso has a career collegiate coaching record of 889-298-2 (.748) and holds an overall record of 727-240-2 (.750) at the University of Oklahoma. She has won more Big 12 games (186-61) than any coach in the league's history and has twice as many wins as any other coach in OU history. Gasso's Sooner teams have finished second or higher 11 different times since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996. They have won 75 percent of their Big 12 contests and OU has claimed four Big 12 regular season and three tournament titles under her direction.

Numerous Sooner players have prospered under Gasso's tutelage and garnered national, regional and conference recognition. She has directed 32 All-Americans, 61 All-Region honorees and 101 all-conference selections.

In the Big 12 era, six Sooners have been named Big 12 Player of the Year, two have been selected as Big 12 Freshman of the Year, one as Big 12 Newcomer and Lauren Eckermann was named OU's first Big 12 Pitcher of the Year in 2007.

In addition, 2005 graduate Heather Scaglione was a two-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year. Savannah Long became the first infielder to earn the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year honor in 2008. Most recently, Amber Flores was named Big 12 Player of the Year in 2009.

The OU softball success under Gasso has also spilled over into the classroom where the Sooners have been honored with 73 academic all-conference honors. Six of those have gone on to become Academic All-Americans, including Lana Moran, the 2000 Academic All-American of the Year.

Gasso and her staff have consistently been recognized for their efforts on and off the field. The staff was awarded three consecutive Speedline/NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards from 1999-2001 and received the national honor in 2000. Gasso and staff have claimed the Midwest honor in five of their 15 seasons with the most recent award coming in 2004. In addition, Gasso has been named the Big 12 and Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1996, 1999 and 2000. She was named the 2009 Big 12 Coach of the Year.

Gasso's career with the Sooners began in 1995 when she arrived at OU after five successful years at Long Beach City College. Her accomplishments during her tenure at LBCC and since led to Gasso being named to the LBCC Hall of Champions in 2004. Later during the 2004 summer, Gasso was inducted into the inaugural class of the Long Beach City Baseball and Softball Hall of Fame. Her success in her hometown of Long Beach set the foundation for a spectacular career in Norman.

In her first season at the helm, the Sooners recorded a 43-23 record, finished second in the conference and reached the regional final. Several Sooners received awards for their play during the 1995 season, including 11 players who garnered all-conference accolades (four on the first team).

Gasso and the Sooners reached new heights in 1996, recording a 50-20 record, a first-ever Big 12 Championship, and another regional final berth. OU dominated the inaugural Big 12 Tournament, putting five players on the all-tournament squad. Pitcher Jill Most was named the tourney MVP.

Gasso's 1996 squad also became the first team outside of the states of California or Arizona to win the prestigious Pony Tournament. Gasso was recognized by her peers for her team's performance, earning the Big 12 Coach-of-the-Year award. Again, Sooner players were mentioned as some of the league's best with 10 players receiving All-Big 12 recognition.

Gasso continued the trend of reaching new heights in 1997 when the team recorded the then-second best record in school history (55-19). The season was highlighted by two impressive 12-game winning streaks that helped the team to a second-place finish in the Big 12. For the fourth consecutive year, OU advanced to a NCAA Regional. It marked the first time in school history that OU hosted the event.

The 1998 season was probably one of Gasso's best coaching jobs. However, it wasn't because of the number of wins and losses or the tournaments won by the Sooners. It was due to the fact the team featured six freshmen. Gasso led the young group to a 49-15 record, a second-place conference finish and a No. 1 seed in a NCAA Regional. Five Sooners were named to the all-conference squad and three players were named to the All-Region team.

In 1999, Gasso led OU to its sixth straight NCAA regional playoff appearance and her team continued to demonstrate that she is one of the top coaches in the country. Along the path to the regional playoffs in Baton Rouge, La., the Sooners seized several awards and honors. For the second time in the three-year history of the Big 12 Conference, OU was crowned regular season champion. The Sooners, who finished with a 40-16 overall record, won the Big 12 with an 11-3 record.

Oklahoma fell just short of its goal, the Women's College World Series, but the Sooners proved once again that they were a national powerhouse. That year, OU defeated several top-25 teams including Louisiana State, Texas, Massachusetts, Oregon, Texas A&M, Missouri and Nebraska. In addition, the Sooners swept the four-game series with state rival Oklahoma State. The last victory against the Cowgirls in the regular season finale clinched the Big 12 title.

Not only were Gasso's players honored for their accomplishments in 1999, but she was also recognized for her solid coaching effort. Gasso was named the 1999 Big 12 Coach of the Year and joined her staff as the Midwest Regional Coaching Staff of the Year.

The 2000 Sooners won their third Big 12 regular season title since the league began in 1996 and hosted their first NCAA Regional since 1997. Behind an explosive offense and a dominant defense, the Sooners rolled to a 66-8 record and won their final eight games of the season to capture the first softball national championship in school history.

Four Sooners earned All-America honors, with Lisa Carey and Ashli Barrett earning first team recognition. Outfielder Erin Evans and pitcher Jennifer Stewart were both third team All-Americans and Stewart was named the Most Outstanding Player of the WCWS. The accolades rolled in as Gasso was named the *Dallas Morning News* Big 12 Coach of the Year. She and her staff also earned the Midwest Region Coach of the Year award and Speedline/NFCA Division I National Coaching Staff of the Year.

Following the 2000 National Championship season, Gasso's 2001 squad continued the string of success. The 2001 team went on to match many of the accomplishments of the previous year, including a return trip to the Women's College World Series, a 50-win season and four All-America selections. The team also established its own successes by compiling a school-record 23-game win streak and the program's first Big 12 Tournament title since 1996.

In 2002, Oklahoma went 49-16 and 14-2 in the Big 12. Taking their team motto "Triple Threat" to heart, the Sooners swept their third consecutive NCAA Regional and advanced to a third straight Women's College World Series.

The 2003 squad was led by five seniors and sophomore hurler Kami Keiter. OU reached its fourth consecutive WCWS by becoming the first Sooner squad to claim a regional championship away from Norman. OU ended the season with a 47-14 record and won one game before being eliminated from the 2003 WCWS.

Five Sooners were named to the All-Big 12 Conference first team including senior Leah Gulla, who led the conference in batting average, hits and RBI. Underclassmen Keiter, Heather Scaglione and Kristin Vesely joined senior Evans on the all-conference team. The NFCA bestowed All-America honors on Keiter and Gulla, while Evans joined the duo on the Midwest Region Team.

The OU program reached a couple of milestones during the 2003 season. The program recorded its 1,000th victory when the Sooners knocked off Bethune-Cookman in its regional opener on May 15. Justifying its nickname, the Sooners also became the first Big 12 team to reach the 100-win mark in conference play. OU beat Nebraska, 1-0, in Lincoln on March 20, 2003, to be the first squad to reach the century mark.

The 2004 season went down as one of the most memorable in Sooner history. OU battled through injuries during the entire regular season and peaked at the right time. OU, seeded second in the NCAA Region I Championship, stormed through Tucson, Ariz., knocking off No. 1 Arizona and No. 9 Louisiana-Lafayette en route to the Sooners' fifth consecutive WCWS.

The Sooners entered the WCWS as the hottest hitting team in the postseason and held onto that recognition, despite being eliminated after winning their opener against Washington. Gasso's staff was recognized for a fifth time as the NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year, thanks to one of the most memorable postseason runs in NCAA history.

In 2005, the Sooners made their 11th straight NCAA postseason appearance under Gasso and claimed the Regional 14 Championship in front of the home crowd in Norman. Despite missing out on its sixth straight WCWS appearance after dropping a best-of-three series to Arizona in the NCAA Super Regional, the Sooners were one of the best hitting teams in program history (fourth in the nation with a .320 batting average). The highlight of the season was OU's record 29-game winning streak that spanned 36

days and was extended during play in five different states. The Sooners outscored opponents 218-40, run ruled 10 opponents and claimed five tourney championships during the streak.

In 2006, Gasso led the Sooners to their 13th straight 40-win season. The young Sooner squad made a strong postseason run, winning 12 of its final 15 contests to finish second in the Big 12 Championship and advance to the NCAA Regional Finals for the seventh consecutive year.

In 2008, the Sooners advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals and finished second in the Big 12 with an overall record of 47-14 and 16-2 in league play. In addition to Savannah Long being named the Big 12's Defensive Player of the Year, she and four teammates were named first team All-Big 12. Four Sooners earned All-Midwest Region first team honors with another on the second team.

The 2009 Oklahoma softball team wrapped up the year 41-16 overall and 14-4 in Big 12 play. The Sooners won their fourth Big 12 regular season title and hosted an NCAA Regional for the second consecutive year. Flores was named Big 12 Player of the Year and Gasso earned her fourth Big 12 Coach of the Year honor.

Flores was named a first team All-America selection by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association and senior Samantha Ricketts was named to the second team. Flores, Ricketts, junior Lindsey Vandever and senior D.J. Mathis were named to the first team All-Central Region by the organization. Flores was also a top 10 finalist for USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year.

Five Sooners were named to the first team All-Big 12 team and three were named to the second team. OU placed five student-athletes on the All-Big 12 Academic team. Flores was named Big 12 Player of the Week three times, while Huey earned the honor once. Mathis was also named Big 12 Pitcher of the Week once during the season. Flores earned NFCA/Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week honors and ESPN/USA Softball National Player of the Week honors on Feb. 10.

Gasso and her husband, Jim, reside in Norman with their youngest son, D.J., a freshman at Norman North. The couple's oldest son, J.T., plays baseball at East Central University in Ada, Okla.

Now in her 13th season as a full-time coach, Melyssa Lombardi continues to guide the Sooner pitchers and catchers to even greater accomplishments. Lombardi was promoted to her current position of associate head coach in July 2007.

Drawing from her playing days as a catcher for the Sooners from 1995-96, Lombardi has lent her valuable experiences in tutoring the Oklahoma catchers and pitchers. During her tenure, the Sooners won the 2000 National Championship and have won eight NCAA Regional Championships in 13 postseason appearances. In addition the Sooners have claimed three Big 12 regular season titles (1999, 2000, 2009) and two conference tournament championships (2001, 2007).

A former all-conference catcher for the Sooners, Lombardi has also coached the Oklahoma battery to a combined 10 All-America honors, 20 All-Region accolades and 27 All-Big 12 selections during her time in Norman.

Lombardi guided catcher Heather Scaglione to two straight All-America first team honors in 2004 and 2005. The only two-time first team All-American in school history was also named the Big 12's Defensive Player of the Year in those same years. Scaglione remains the only player in Big 12 history to receive the honor twice.

The 2007 season was one of the most successful for the OU battery. The team posted a 55-8 overall record and Lauren Eckermann earned Big 12 Pitcher of the Year honors. Eckermann went on to be named an All-American and tied the school record for most wins in a season with 37. In 2008, pitcher D.J. Mathis and catcher Lindsey Vandever earned All-Midwest Region and All-Big 12 honors. Mathis also earned second team All-America honors and ranked among the nation's best in several NCAA categories. Vandever and Mathis earned all-Big 12 honors in 2009 and were named to the NFCA All-Central Region team.

In 2004, Lombardi may have had her biggest challenge since joining the OU staff. The pitching coach had to hold together a staff that was missing its No. 1 and No. 2 pitcher for a combined total of 51 games. Despite the shortage of arms, the Sooners were the third best staff (in terms of ERA) in the Big 12. Lombardi's protégé Kami Keiter turned it up another notch during the postseason when she garnered All-Big 12 Tournament and Region I Championship MVP honors.

In 2003, Lombardi guided Keiter out of the shadows of former Sooner great Jennifer Stewart and into stardom. In just her second collegiate season, Keiter led the Big 12 in wins (47) and was ranked in the NCAA top 15 in two pitching categories. The Sooner pitching staff combined for an ERA of 1.40, which ranked as the 18th best in the NCAA.

In her first year on the coaching staff as a student assistant in 1997, the OU pitching staff produced one of the lowest earned run averages in school history and in the country.

The staff finished with a 1.14 ERA to rank seventh in the nation. The Sooners' pitching performances continued to rank among the nation's elite in 1998 and 1999 and the Sooners' improvement culminated in 2000 with a national championship.

In the national championship season, the team registered a 1.44 ERA which was good enough for second in the Big 12 and ranked 25th nationally. The staff posted 24 shutouts and its best strikeout total in three years with 301.

Lombardi helped guide the one-two punch of Lana Moran and Stewart that year. Moran went 26-2 and led the Big 12 with a 1.28 ERA. Stewart was a third team All-America selection and the MOP of the Women's College World Series. Lombardi also helped catcher Ashli Barrett reach new heights as the junior was named a first team All-American.

The Glendale, Ariz., native ended her two-year Sooner playing career with a spectacular senior season in 1996. Her team-leading .345 batting average was a key factor during OU's Big 12 Conference Championship run that year.

She was also instrumental in helping Jill Most and Jennifer Jaime record two of the best pitching seasons in school history. Lombardi caught all three of Most's wins in OU's conference tournament games and was named to the all-tournament team after going 3-for-8 (.375) at the plate with four RBI, two runs scored, a triple and a stolen base.

Lombardi graduated from Oklahoma in 1997 with a degree in health and sports science. She and her husband, John, were married on Nov. 10, 2000. The couple has one child, a son, Gianni Thomas.



MacKay was instrumental in all aspects of the softball side of the academy including pitching, hitting, fielding, catching, base running and position specific skills.

While serving as an instructor at Performance Edge, MacKay found time to broaden his coaching credentials. The Columbus, Miss., native served as a hitting instructor at Mike Candrea's University of Arizona Summer and Holiday Camps. 





David L. Boren, who has served Oklahoma as governor and U.S. senator, became the thirteenth president of the University of Oklahoma in November 1994. He is the first person in state history to have served in all three positions.

Boren is widely respected for his academic credentials, his longtime support of education, and for his distinguished political career as a reformer of the American political system. A graduate of Yale University in 1963, Boren majored in American history, graduated in the top one percent of his class and was elected Phi Beta Kappa. He was selected as a Rhodes Scholar and earned a master's degree in politics, philosophy and economics from Oxford University, England, in 1965.

In 1968, he received a law degree from the University of Oklahoma College of Law, where he was on the *Law Review*, elected to the Order of the Coif, and won the Bledsoe Prize as the outstanding graduate by a vote of the faculty.

As Oklahoma's governor from 1974 through 1978, Boren promoted key educational initiatives that have had an enduring impact on Oklahoma. Established during his tenure were the Oklahoma Arts Institute, the Scholar-Leadership Enrichment Program, and the Oklahoma Physicians Manpower Training Program, which provides scholarships for medical students and medical personnel who commit to practice in underserved rural areas. Also, the first state funding for Gifted and Talented classes was provided in 1976 and, from 1976 through 1978, Oklahoma ranked first among all states in the percentage increases of funding for higher education.

One of Boren's most far-reaching projects in promoting quality education at all levels is the Oklahoma Foundation for Excellence, which he founded in 1985. The foundation recognizes outstanding public school students and teachers and helps establish private local foundations to help give academic endowment grants to local public schools. As a senator, he was the author of the National Security Education Act in 1992, which provides scholarships for study abroad and for learning additional languages, as well as legislation to restore the tax deductibility of gifts of appreciated property to universities in 1993.

Boren, also a former state legislator, spent nearly three decades in elective politics before becoming the president of the University of Oklahoma. Boren was the youngest governor in the nation when he served from 1974 to 1978. Known as a reformer, Boren campaigned with a broom as his symbol. During his term, he instituted many progressive programs, including conflict-of-interest rules, campaign-financing disclosure, stronger open meeting laws for public bodies, more competitive bidding on state government contracts, and reform of the state's prison system, including expanded education programs for first-time offenders and the largest expansion of the work-release program in state history.

During his time in the U.S. Senate from 1979 to 1994, Boren served on the Senate Finance and Agriculture Committees and was the longest-serving chairman of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence. From his days as a state legislator and governor of Oklahoma to Washington, Boren carried a commitment to reform, leading numerous efforts to make government work better for American citizens. As chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, he strengthened oversight of secret government programs and reformed the procedures for Presidential notice of such programs to Congress.

For more than 10 years, he led the fight for congressional campaign finance reform and for legislation discouraging administration and congressional staff from cashing in on government experience and contacts by becoming lobbyists. In addition, he introduced legislation seeking to limit gifts and travel subsidies that government workers, including members of Congress, can receive from lobbyists. Boren also chaired the special 1992-93 Joint Committee on the Organization of Congress, which produced pro-

posals to make Congress more efficient and responsive by streamlining congressional bureaucracy, reducing staff sizes and reforming procedures to end legislative gridlock.

Boren left the U.S. Senate in 1994 with an approval rating of 91 percent after being reelected with 83 percent of the vote in 1990, the highest percentage in the nation in a U.S. Senate contest in that election year.

Boren served from 1988 to 1997 as a member of the Yale University Board of Trustees. His university experience also includes four years on the faculty of Oklahoma Baptist University, where he was chairman of the Department of Political Science and chairman of the Division of Social Sciences. In 1993, the American Association of University Professors presented Boren with the Henry Yost Award as Education Advocate of the Year. In April 2004, Boren received the Mory's Cup from the Mory's Association at Yale University. In making the presentation to Boren it was noted that he was the first Yale graduate in the university's history extending over three centuries to have served as a Governor, U.S. Senator and President of a major university.

Under Boren's leadership, the University of Oklahoma has developed and emerged as a "pacesetter university in American public higher education," with 20 major new programs initiated since his inauguration. They include establishment of the Honors College, the Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West, a new expository writing program for freshmen modeled on the program at Harvard, an interdisciplinary religious studies program, the Artist-in-Residence Program, the International Programs Center, and the Faculty-in-Residence Program putting faculty family apartments in student residence halls. The Retired Professors Program has been started, bringing 50 retired full professors back to the University to teach freshmen.

The number of new facilities started or completed on the campus during the Boren years has matched the explosion in new programs. Since 1994, almost \$1 billion in construction projects have been completed or are under way on OU's three campuses. Among the largest of the recent projects are the \$18.7 million renovation and expansion of historic Holmberg Hall, home of music and dance programs; the \$67 million National Weather Center; the \$19 million addition to the Michael F. Price College of Business; the \$17 million Gaylord Hall for journalism and mass communication; the \$27 million Stephenson Research and Technology Center; and the \$83.5 million stadium project. The Health Sciences Center has a new Student Union, and the new \$24 million Stanton L. Young Biomedical Research Center.


Presidential Travel Scholarships, students from 111 countries on campus, more reciprocal international exchange agreements than any other university and the new International Programs Center are all making OU more international. The new Honors College helps to assure that no students need to leave Oklahoma to find an educational experience to match their potential.

In 1995, Boren launched the "Reach for Excellence" fundraising campaign with a five-year goal of \$200 million, which was twice as large as any fundraising drive in Oklahoma history. The drive exceeded \$500 million, raising OU into the top 15 public universities in the United States in private endowment per capita. Since 1994, endowed professorships have more than quadrupled and the OU donor base has grown from 18,000 to more than 107,000 friends and alumni. During the first 10 years of Boren's tenure over \$1 billion in private gifts were donated to the university.

Above all, the Boren years have been marked by an emphasis on putting students first. There is not a university president in the country that is more committed to students as his number one priority. He teaches a freshman-level course in political science each semester and is one of the few presidents of major universities to teach.

Boren is married to Molly Shi Boren, a former judge and English teacher. Mrs. Boren is President Emeritus of the Oklahoma Arts Institute, which provides education programs in nine arts disciplines for high school students from across the state who are gifted in the arts. Molly Boren has two degrees from the University of Oklahoma, a master's degree in English and a Juris Doctorate from the OU College of Law.

A native of Seminole, Boren has two children, Carrie Christine Boren, an Episcopal minister, and David Daniel Boren, a member of the United States Congress from Oklahoma. Devoting much of his life to public service, Boren drew from the example of his parents, the late Congressman Lyle H. Boren and Christine Boren.

The success of the University of Oklahoma Athletics Department is known throughout the world of intercollegiate athletics. The last decade may stand as one of the most successful in school history and leading that effort is Joe Castiglione, the Sooner AD since 1998.

Castiglione's Sooner team has worked to create a place where competitive dreams come true and academic goals are reached with regularity. Excellence is the norm at OU, and the Sooners' sports programs, student-athletes, coaches and staff are committed to that standard.

For Castiglione, though, it's not just about the championships and trophies. The victories that he celebrates with his Sooners include graduation rates

that continue to climb, record-setting grade point averages and academic honors. The true measure of achievement for Castiglione and, by extension, the department's coaches and staff, is measured in the success of the student-athletes in relation to the department's mission statement "Inspiring champions today . . . Preparing leaders for tomorrow."

With the support of OU President David L. Boren and OU's seven-member Board of Regents, Castiglione has gone about creating a climate that creates lofty goals, high standards and a commitment to ethical behavior that is second to none.

Since arriving at OU in 1998 after an outstanding career at Missouri, Castiglione has seen the Sooners finish in the top 30 of the Learfield Director's Cup in nine of the last 11 years. Through his insistence that daily and long-term decisions be made in a financially responsible manner, the department has closed the books in the black in each of the last 11 years. In 2009, the department increased its direct support of the academic mission of the University by increasing its annual commitment to \$4 million dollars. Through direct and indirect support, OU Athletics, under Castiglione's leadership, provides more than \$7 million to OU Academics.

The 11th director of athletics in University of Oklahoma history, Castiglione is quick to give full credit to the student-athletes and coaches, the staff, OU President David L. Boren, the OU Board of Regents, the donors and the fans for the success experienced during his tenure. It was that commitment to a team approach emphasis that was one of the many qualities that the search committee recognized when they recommended Castiglione to university administration in 1998.

In recognition of the performance of OU's teams on the field and in the classroom, of the fiscal stability created during his tenure, the dramatic increases in donor giving, facility construction and renovations, and the cutting-edge programs that the department has begun during his tenure, Castiglione was named Athletic Director of the Year in May 2009 by the Sports Business Journal.

That award was one of several earned by Castiglione and the department. The 2007 PRISM Award winner, presented by the School of Sports Management at the University of Massachusetts, OU was just the second Division I winner and all of the programs recognized by the selection panel were started under Castiglione's leadership with the full support of university administration.

His peers have honored him for the department's achievements as well. In October 2004, the Bobby Dodd Foundation named him Athletics Director of the Year. In 2003, he was inducted into the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators Hall of Fame. In June 2001, he received the General Robert R. Neyland Athletic Director Award for lifetime achievement from the All-American Football Foundation. The National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) named him Central Region AD of the Year in 2000.

The achievement that may bring him the most pride, though, came in May 2007 when he completed his master's of education degree from OU. To understand the need for education and lifelong learning, OU's student-athletes just have to look at their AD who started and completed his master's degree while running the department and maintaining his priorities to his family. He quickly put his experience to use as an adjunct professor in the College of Education, teaching a graduate class in Marketing & Development.

In his tenure, OU has celebrated seven national team championships and more than 40 conference team titles; record numbers of graduating student-athletes and record-setting grade point averages for Sooner teams; dramatically increased donor giving; huge increases in ticket sales for all sports; major facility improvements, and development and construction of new facilities.

Castiglione was instrumental in the athletics department's major campaign, Great Expectations: The Campaign For Sooner Sports. The campaign ended in November of 2003 with more than \$125 million raised. The figure has grown to almost \$200 million since then as funds continue to be raised for facility improvements and scholarship endowments. The largest fund-raising effort in OU athletics history includes projects that impact each of OU's nearly 500 student-athletes and has become a national model for intercollegiate athletics.

Hired on April 30, 1998, Castiglione joined the Sooner family after serving as athletics director at Missouri. In his 17-year career with the Tigers, Castiglione, who was named director of athletics at Missouri on Dec. 15, 1993, was credited with rebuilding sports programs, hiring outstanding coaches, implementing an innovative master plan for facilities, inspiring record-setting increases in fund-raising and balancing the budget in each of his five years as athletics director.

A 1979 Maryland graduate, Castiglione received the University's Distinguished Alumnus Award in April 2007. He began his career as the sports promotions director at Rice. He then worked a year as director of athletic fund-raising at Georgetown before being hired in 1981 at Missouri as director of communications and marketing.

His commitment to the success of student-athletes has gone beyond the Norman campus and he has served at national and conference level. He chairs the NCAA's Football Academic Progress Rate (APR) Working Group and is currently serving on the Gatorade Collegiate Advisory Board and the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame Board of Directors. He served two terms as chair of the Big 12 Board of Athletics Directors and is a past president of both the Division I-A Athletic Directors Association and NACDA. He served a four-year term on the NCAA Championship/Competition Cabinet and the NCAA Baseball Committee and is a past member of the NCAA Football Special Events Certification Committee. He recently served on the NCAA Diversity Leadership Strategic Planning Committee and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Discussion Group. A member of the Phi Delta Theta Foundation Board of Trustees, he is a highly requested speaker at annual conventions and continuing education institutes.

A native of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., Castiglione is married to the former Kristen Bartel, a 1990 graduate of the University of Missouri. They are the parents of two sons, Joseph Robert, Jr. and Jonathan Edmund.

BACK TO THE TOP

SOONERS OVERCOME CHALLENGES TO WIN FOURTH BIG 12 REGULAR SEASON TITLE

When it became evident senior pitcher **D.J. Mathis** would miss a significant amount of time due to a shoulder injury, most gave up on the University of Oklahoma softball team. Forced to turn to a group of freshmen pitchers, the Sooners were immediately thrust into has-been status. Forget the fact Oklahoma returned powerful offensive weapons. The Sooners could put runs on the scoreboard, but relying on inexperienced freshmen pitchers to carry a program would be too much to ask, according to the experts.

The problem is someone forgot to tell the Sooners of their newly acquired standing. It was the beginning of an educational seminar that would produce results that surpassed most. The growing pains experienced early by the young group proved to be the necessary catalyst needed for Oklahoma to win its fourth Big 12 regular season title.

It might not have been pretty. At times it seemed like a daunting task, and it was never easy. For a team picked to win the league title in the preseason, OU certainly took the long road to get there. In the end, they learned more about their ability, self-confidence and the power of teamwork.

In what has become standard in Norman, the Sooners again faced one of the nation's toughest schedules. Oklahoma's slate featured 21 teams that played in the previous season's

NCAA Tournament, including defending national champion Arizona State and runner-up Texas A&M. The Sooners took the program's first trip outside of the continental United States as OU opened the year in Hawai'i. Oklahoma also co-hosted The Preview presented by Worth, an event which featured Northwestern and Tennessee.

The Sooners met the challenges, finishing with a 41-16 record, the 16th straight 40-plus win season for OU. Oklahoma also made its 16th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. OU ended Big 12 play with a 14-4 mark and captured its fourth Big 12 regular season title after sweeping Missouri in Columbia.

How they got there, however, is the real story of the 2009 season. It is testament to diligence, hard work and fight.

The Sooners' biggest challenge of their opening weekend was the travel and time change from Norman to Honolulu. It took eight hours via plane and the four-hour time difference required serious adjustment. After dropping its opening game to host Hawai'i, Oklahoma rebounded to win four straight to take the Rainbow Wahine Classic title.

After getting off to a great start, the following weekend proved rather dreary in more ways than one. A rain-soaked Houston, Texas, and the Marriott Classic was the next stop.

OU was stunned in its opener, falling to N.C. State, 2-1. Fighting Mother Nature, the Sooners won their next two games to move to 6-2 on the early season.

Oklahoma got its first taste of the big stage at the Cathedral City Classic. The Sooners opened with wins over Cal Poly and defending national champion Arizona State. OU followed with another win over a ranked opponent in Nevada before falling to No. 1 Alabama in a seven-inning thriller. OU closed out the tournament with a win over Massachusetts.

Cathedral City was the last time Mathis would take the circle for the Sooners for a long time. A reoccurrence of an injury she first suffered as a sophomore kept her from starting another game for an entire month. With the abrupt absence, the Sooners turned to freshmen pitchers **Allee Allen** and **Kirsten Allen**.

Behind the Allens, Oklahoma entered The Preview presented by Worth on a four-game win streak. Tennessee dealt Oklahoma a home loss to open the event. The Sooners also fell to Tennessee the following day, 6-5 in eight innings, and took down Northwestern on the same day, 4-3. Northwestern defeated OU on the final day in Oklahoma City.

Oklahoma opened conference play early, squeezing in a doubleheader with Texas Tech between flights to California for the Judi Garman Classic. Tech was no match for the power-laden OU offense as the Sooners won 6-1 and 12-0.

The Sooners returned to another high-profile tournament at the Garman and, without Mathis, the looming task would be left up to a pair of rookies to manage. OU dropped its first contest to Notre Dame 4-3 but the young group rebounded to win three straight over ranked opponents before falling to host Cal State Fullerton 4-3. The Sooners closed out the event with an 8-0 blanking of Bowling Green.

Returning home, the Sooners hosted Northern Iowa in a non-conference contest, winning 8-0 before hosting Iowa State in its Big 12 home opener. OU swept the Cyclones 10-7 and 10-0 before dropping North Texas in a non-conference game at home and again on the road.

The following weekend, Oklahoma traveled to Austin to face rival Texas. It was a forgettable weekend from a results standpoint. The Sooners were able to put runs on the board but it seemed the pressure piled upon OU's young pitching duo finally exploded. After dropping 16-5 and 9-7 decisions to the Longhorns, Oklahoma had some soul-searching to do.

Over the next two weeks, the Sooners went 4-3 and many began to question Oklahoma's position as a threat within the league. Entering the first Bedlam contest of the season against Oklahoma State, many wondered if this was the year the Cowgirls would finally claim the Bedlam Bell.

When later asked about the week leading up to the game, the only explanation given was "something clicked."

And, did it ever.

Behind a grand slam from junior **Amber Flores**, the Sooners won 8-1 but, more importantly, whatever "it" was that clicked proved to be the driving force behind a revival.

Oklahoma was back - and big time.

The Sooners were right in the chase to capture the regular season title and had the opportunity to clinch at least a share of the honor on the road at Missouri. It is never easy playing on the road in the Big 12 and especially with something of importance on the line. The Tigers needed just one win to crush OU's dreams but an unlikely cast of characters came through for Oklahoma.

OU won the first game 6-2 and took the second 4-2 to absolutely shock Missouri. Even better, the regular season finale in Stillwater got even more exciting, because with a win, Oklahoma could win the title outright. A loss meant sharing the regular season championship — something OU was not about to let happen.

After the game was pushed back one day due to heavy rains, freshman **Katie Norris** returned to her hometown anxious to leave her mark on the Oklahoma program. In front of her family, friends and neighbors, Norris connected on a seventh-inning grand slam to propel Oklahoma over the Cowgirls, 6-2.

Entering the Big 12 Championship as the overall top seed, the Sooners opened with a 3-0 win over Iowa State before getting revenge against Texas, dropping the Longhorns 6-2. After winning nine straight, Oklahoma's win streak came to an end in the championship game, falling 5-0 to Missouri.

The Sooners were rewarded with the nation's No. 7 national seed and hosted a regional. In another learning experience for Oklahoma's young pitchers, the Sooners bowed out in regional play. North Dakota State downed the Sooners 1-0 in an 11-inning, two-day affair. Mathis started in the circle for OU and took herself out of the game after the ninth inning. It would be the last time she pitched for Oklahoma.

With the dreams of the Sooners' season lying on the shoulders of the Allens, Oklahoma rebounded to throttle Arkansas 21-2 in an offensive record-setting explosion. Oklahoma was one win away from advancing to a regional championship rematch against North Dakota State until Tulsa hit a walk-off home run in the bottom of the seventh to end OU's season.

The tears flowed following the abrupt loss, especially for pitcher **Kirsten Allen**, who picked up the loss against the Golden Hurricane. The experience, while heartbreaking, was another lesson in the rapid education of Oklahoma's future in the circle.

Oklahoma led the Big 12 with eight all-conference selections. Gasso was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year for the fourth time in her career. Flores became the sixth Sooner to be named Big 12 Player of the Year. Flores and **Samantha Ricketts** each earned All-America honors and four Sooners were named All-Region. Five OU players were named to the All-Big 12 Academic first team.

Flores earned first team All-America honors after leading the league in a majority of statistical categories. She was also a top 10 finalist for USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year. Flores was, without question, the most feared offensive player in the league.

Coupled with a lineup of other potent options, opponents were often forced to pitch to Flores and she made the most of it. In 220 plate appearances, Flores hit .416 and produced an astonishing slugging percentage of .872. She drew a single-season record 49 walks and was hit by a pitch 19 times.

Ricketts was named to the All-America second team and was an All-Big 12 first team selection. Ricketts hit just behind Flores in the lineup, recording a .322 average and leading the team in doubles with 15. She ended her stellar Oklahoma career as the Big 12 career leader in runs batted in with 239.

Along with Flores and Ricketts, Mathis, **Katie Norris** and **Krystle Huey** earned first team all-conference honors, while **Chana'e Jones**, **Lindsey Vandever** and **Haley Anderson** were named to the second team. Flores, Ricketts, Mathis and Vandever earned all-region honors, as well.

The individual awards are a strong indication of exactly how hard Oklahoma worked to get back to the top of the league standings, but the experience garnered by this group is far more valuable.



1975-76 Sooners

MARCH 19, 1975

The University of Oklahoma plays its first intercollegiate softball contest. The home team downed Oklahoma Baptist, 3-1.

APRIL 9, 1975

Oklahoma recorded its first intercollegiate softball win over archrival Oklahoma State as the Cowgirls began their intercollegiate season one year earlier. Since 1975, the two teams are almost dead even in the series with the Sooners holding a 67-66 advantage. Oklahoma has won 15 straight in the Bedlam series.

MARCH 23, 1976

Oklahoma plays its latest recorded spring opener. The Sooners fell 13-8 to Central Oklahoma and 16-6 to USAO in Norman.

MARCH 27, 1977

The Sooners drop Wichita State 7-2 in Wichita. It was the first road win for head coach Marita Hynes against a non-Oklahoma school.

APRIL 18-MAY 5, 1978

The Sooners win eight straight to secure a winning season during Marita Hynes' second year at the helm of the OU program.

MARCH 14, 1979

In what has become one of softball's most intense rivalries, Oklahoma split a doubleheader with Arizona in what becomes the first contests between the two schools. Arizona took the opening game 4-3, while OU bounced back to win the second, 4-3.

APRIL 7, 1979

Oklahoma and Texas Woman's University battle in the longest game in OU softball history. TWU won 1-0 in 20 innings. The tournament final started in Springfield, Mo. and was completed later that day in Norman.

MAY 4, 1979

Oklahoma defeats Stephen F. Austin 4-3 in 15 innings at Reaves Park, the longest home game in OU history.

SEPTEMBER 14, 1979

Oklahoma tops Saint Mary's (Calif.) 15-0 in its first competitive fall contest. Teams counted wins in both the fall and spring seasons from 1979 until the fall of 1981.

MAY 20-21, 1982

Oklahoma hosted the final AIAW Softball Championship in Norman.

MARCH 8, 1984

The Sooners open the final season of the Marita Hynes era with wins over Mesa Community College (4-1) and New Mexico Highlands (3-2 [9]).

MAY 21, 1994

The Sooners close out a 58-15 campaign with a 4-1 win over Providence at the NCAA Regional in Stillwater. It marked Jim Beitia's lone season as head coach and was the first of what is now 16 consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament.

OCTOBER 24, 1994

Oklahoma names Patty Gasso the fifth head coach in the program's history.

FEBRUARY 18-20, 1994

The Sooners win six straight en route to Oklahoma's first 50-plus win season.

APRIL 2, 1995

Sooner pitcher Brea Moore strikes out an OU individual single game record 18 batters in Oklahoma's win over Iowa State.

MARCH 17, 1996

Casey Dickson becomes the first Oklahoma player to be named Big 12 Player of the Week.

MARCH 30, 1996

Oklahoma gets its first Big 12 conference win — a 5-2 victory at home over Iowa State.

MAY 11, 1996

Oklahoma won its first Big 12 Championship with a 1-0 win over No. 18 Nebraska. Earlier in the year, the Sooners captured their first-ever regular season title.

MARCH 9, 1997

Sooner pitcher Jill Most throws the first perfect game in Oklahoma softball history. OU defeated No. 24 Baylor 3-0 in Oklahoma City.

MARCH 6, 1998

Oklahoma defeats top-ranked Arizona, 4-3 in Tucson. It was the Sooners' first-ever win over the nation's No. 1 team.



TIMELINE

APRIL 16, 1998

The Sooners defeat third-ranked Fresno State in back-to-back games in Norman (4-2 and 8-7 [10]). The Bulldogs won the national championship later that season.

APRIL 30, 1999

Oklahoma polishes off its second Big 12 regular season title with a 6-2 win at Oklahoma State.

APRIL 30, 2000

The Sooners capture their third Big 12 regular season title with a 6-2 win over Kansas.

MAY 29, 2000

Oklahoma wins its first-ever national championship in softball. It was also the first national title for a women's program at OU. The Sooners went through the tournament undefeated, taking down No. 10 California (2-1), No. 8 Southern Mississippi (3-1) and No. 2 Arizona (1-0) before defeating No. 3 UCLA (3-1) in the championship game.

APRIL 19, 2001 & APRIL 21, 2001

Oklahoma wins 16-0 over Oklahoma State (4/19) and Baylor (4/21). The margin is the largest by OU in a Big 12 game.

MAY 12, 2001

The Sooners win their second Big 12 Championship with a 6-0 win over archrival Oklahoma State.

MARCH 22, 2003

Oklahoma beats No. 24 Kansas 3-1 to record the 100th Big 12 regular season win at the OU Softball Complex.

APRIL 22, 2003

The Sooner softball program recorded its 1,000 win with an 8-0 victory at Tulsa.

APRIL 24, 2004

The field at the OU Softball Complex was dedicated and named Marita Hynes Field, in honor of Oklahoma's longtime former senior woman administrator. Hynes was also the second softball coach in Oklahoma's history and responsible for hiring Patty Gasso.

FEBRUARY 4, 2005

The Sooners play their earliest recorded spring opener. Oklahoma defeated Florida Atlantic 12-0 (5) and Appalachian State 6-2 in Clearwater, Fla.

FEBRUARY 9-11, 2007

Oklahoma won five straight games to begin a 23-game win streak, the longest in school history.

FEBRUARY 27, 2007

Mariee Mena becomes the first Sooner to sweep the national awards in the same week. Mena was named National Player of the Week by both USA Softball and the National Fastpitch Coaches Association.

MAY 12, 2007

The Sooners drop Missouri 7-1 and Texas Tech 6-3 to win their third Big 12 Championship title.

MARCH 26, 2008

Oklahoma defeats Central Arkansas 23-1, the largest margin of victory in history.

FEBRUARY 2, 2009

The Oklahoma softball program takes its first trip outside the continental United States. The Sooners opened the season at the Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Hawai'i.

APRIL 15, 2009

The Sooners defeated archrival Oklahoma State for the 250th win at the OU Softball Complex.

APRIL 30, 2009

The Sooners win the Big 12 regular season title outright, their fourth, after beating Oklahoma State 6-2 in Stillwater.

MAY 16, 2009

North Dakota State prevails over the Sooners in a 1-0, two-day, 11-inning thriller. It is the longest game ever played at the OU Softball Complex (innings).
