A LOOK AT OKLAHOMA AS A TEAM

- ▶ Oklahoma has 23 wins on the year, its most since winning 28 during the 2006 season and second-highest total since winning 26 in 1987.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 23 or more matches nine times in its 35 year history (2010, 2006, 1988, 1987, 1985, 1983, 1980, 1979, 1976).
- ▶ Oklahoma defeated Wichita State for the first time in six tries on December 3 to advance to the NCAA Championship second round.
- ▶ OU got its second win over a ranked opponent this season with a five-set thriller over No. 22 Tulsa on December 4 to advance to the third round.
- ▶ The Sooners played arguably their best match of the season, setting 25-point rally scoring era team records in three categories.
- ▶ OU finished conference play with a 13-7 mark, finishing third. The wins are the most since winning 13 in 2007 and 1997. The most is 17 in 2006.
- ▶ Oklahoma went 8-3 in non-conference play. Two of OU's losses were to ranked Florida State (13) and Tennessee (17) teams.
- ▶ The Sooners have produced their best offensive output since 2006 this season. OU is hitting .227 as a team and averages 13.60 kills per set.
- ▶ The 2006 team that reached the Sweet 16 and had two All-Americans hit .262 and averaged 16.28 kills per set.
- ▶ Likewise, OU is having its best season in the front row since 2006. The Sooners are averaging 2.27 blocks per set, the most since 3.13 in 2006.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 5-7 against the RPI top 50 this year. Seven of OU's 10 losses have come to teams ranked in the top 25.
- ▶ The Sooners are 2-6 against top 25 teams this year and 11-111 all-time.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 12-53 against ranked programs under head coach **Santiago Restrepo**.
- ▶ OU is 3-50 against top 10 opponents all-time and 2-28 under Restrepo. Oklahoma is 0-4 against 10 programs this year.
- ▶ Oklahoma's last win against a top 10 opponent was a 3-2 upset of No. 3 Texas in Austin (Oct. 29, 2008).
- ▶ Oklahoma is 13-15-2 against the Big 10, 7-6 against the ACC and 107-193 against Big 12 opponents in conference matches.

A LOOK AT OKLAHOMA IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

- ▶ The Sooners are making their second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Championship and fourth in the last five years.
- ▶ OU has been to four NCAA Championships under Restrepo and has a 5-3 mark in those matches.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 8-6 all-time in NCAA Championship matches. OU has made three Sweet 16 appearances (2010, 2006, 1988).
- ▶ OU is 7-8 against the NCAA Championship field of 64 with wins over Missouri (twice), Iowa State, Missouri State, Miami, Wichita State and Tulsa.
- ▶ Oklahoma has never advanced past the third round of the NCAA Championship.

A LOOK AT THE REGIONAL

- ▶ Friday's match marks the first-ever series meeting between the Sooners and Nittany Lions.
- ▶ Duke defeated OU 3-0 in the only previous meeting on Aug. 30, 2002 in Los Angeles.
- ▶ Oklahoma leads the all-time series against Big 12 rival Missouri, 39-31 and won both series meetings this year.
- ▶ The average RPI of all four teams is 22.75. Penn State is the No. 4 national seed, while Duke is the No. 12 seed.
- ▶ Missouri and Duke are also meeting for the first time. Missouri and Penn State have met five times previously with PSU winning all five meetings.
- ▶ Penn State leads the all-time series with the Blue Devils, 9-0. The two teams last met in 2009.

RESTREPO RETURNS TO PENNSYLVANIA

Oklahoma head coach **Santiago Restrepo** is one win shy of his 250th career victory. Restrepo returns to the state where his coaching career began. He was the head coach at East Stroudsburg from 1994-97 and played at the school from 1983-86. Restrepo was a Division I-AA All-American in 1986 and a four-time All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference selection. He was inducted into the East Stroudsburg Hall of Fame in 2004.

MORE ON RESTREPO'S COACHING DAYS AT ESU

Restrepo led East Stroudsburg to a 21-11 record and a semifinal finish in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) in his first season in the league. The Warriors posted their best record in school history with a 32-2 mark in 1996. For his team's efforts, Restrepo was named PSAC Coach of the Year. During his tenure, he led ESU to a 75-32 (.735) overall record.

MORE ON RESTREPO'S PLAYING DAYS AT ESU

In addition to his All-America honors and four-time all-conference selection, Restrepo earned team Most Valuable Player honors all four years and was the co-winner of the Senior Athlete Award in 1986.

SOONERS ADVANCE TO SWEET 16

Oklahoma advanced to its third Sweet 16 in program history on December 4 with a five-set win over Tulsa (25-13, 25-22, 26-28, 20-25, 15-9). The Sooners set team school records in hitting percentage (.335), kills (73) and assists (67) for the current scoring era (five sets). Junior setter **Brianne Barker** recorded the first triple-double in Oklahoma school history with a career-high 10 kills, 57 assists and 14 digs. Barker's .625 hitting percentage was the best among OU's starters.

SIXTH TIME'S THE CHARM

The Sooners opened the 2010 NCAA Championship on December 3 with a 3-0 win over Wichita State (-27, -21, -14). It marked Oklahoma's first win over the Shockers since 1999. **Caitlin Higgins** led the Sooners with her ninth double-double of the season. Higgins had a team-best 10 kills and 13 digs, while adding one service ace and two total blocks, including one block solo.

MCLAURIN NAMED BIG 12 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Middle blocker **Sallie McLaurin** was named the 2010 Big 12 Freshman of the Year. McLaurin was also named to the All-Freshman team. McLaurin is the first Sooner to earn Freshman of the Year honors and just the fourth to earn an "of the Year" distinction. Eliane Santos earned Co-Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2006, the same season Anna Monsen earned Co-Libero of the Year. Cathy Cook was the league's Newcomer of the Year in 1999. She is the fifth OU player to be named to the all-freshman team.

BARKER, BOULAVSKY NAMED FIRST TEAM ALL-BIG 12

Juniors **Brianne Barker** and **Suzy Boulavsky** were named to the All-Big 12 first team. Barker and Boulavsky earned first team All-Big 12 honors for the first time in their careers. Barker previously was named honorable mention in 2009 and to the all-freshman team in 2008. Boulavsky was an honorable mention American Volleyball Coaches Association All-Region selection in 2009. Barker and Boulavsky are the third and fourth players to earn the honor. Santos (2006) and Patrice Arrington (1997) were the other two.

ROOKIE MCLAURIN PLAYING LIKE A VETERAN

Freshman **Sallie McLaurin** has played more like a veteran this season. McLaurin leads the Sooners with a .315 hitting percentage and ranks seventh in the Big 12 in the category. She ranks in the top 30 in the nation in blocks per set (1.28) and holds the Oklahoma 25-point rally scoring single season record for block solos (30), block assists (122) and blocks per set average (1.28). Entering his seventh season as the head coach at the University of Oklahoma, Santiago Restrepo has brought the program to new heights. Pairing his international recruiting with his hard-working, blue collar coaching style, Restrepo has made a name for Oklahoma within the volleyball community.

The program felt Restrepo's impact as soon as he arrived on campus from his previous coaching stop at Southern Mississippi. In his first season at the helm of the Sooner program, he led the 2004 OU squad to a 12-17 record. No Sooner squad had produced a better record since the 1997 squad that reached the NCAA Tournament.

While the 2004 season caught many people's eye, nobody would predict what would happen two years later as Restrepo led the Sooners to the best season in school history. The 2006 season broke plenty of OU records and sparked momentum for the 2007 season.

In 2005, Restrepo was placing the elements for the historic next year as his recruiting skills shined with the addition of juco transfer Santos. In her junior season, Santos made her mark on Big 12 volleyball, finishing in the top five in the conference in blocks and kills and was named one of Collegiate Volleyball Update's top-five blockers in the country.

Restrepo earned Big 12 and Regional Coach of the Year honors and was recognized by CVU.com as its National Coach of the Year as he led the Sooners to the best one-year turnaround in Big 12 history. Behind Restrepo's leadership, the Sooners recorded the best winning percentage in school history with a 28-6 record (.824) and finished a program-best second in the Big 12 Conference race (17-3).

Restrepo's successful 2006 season included OU's first-ever win over Texas in the series history as well as entry into the 2006 NCAA Tournament for only the fourth time in school history and the program's second Sweet 16 trip. Oklahoma finished the season as one of the best in the country with a No. 12 final ranking, its highest in history.

The Oklahoma players also felt the presence of Restrepo, individually, as all five seniors of the 2006 class earned All-Big 12 recognition while Joanna Schmitt and Eliane Santos became the second and third All-Americans in school history.

OU did not disappoint in 2007, either. After being picked ninth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Sooners advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season. It also marked the second time in OU history that the Sooners made back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

Senior outside hitter Sarah Weiland represented OU on the All-Big 12 honorable mention team, while freshman Francie Ekwerekwu was named to the All-Big 12 freshman team. For their efforts in the classroom, five Sooners earned Academic All-Big 12 honors and three were named Academic All-District.

In 2008, he coached Brienne Barker and Caitlin Higgins to All-Big 12 Freshman team honors. Higgins became the first Oklahoma player to earn the Sports Imports/American Volleyball Coaches Association Division I National Player of the Week on Nov. 4.

After losing his youngest son to leukemia prior to the start of the 2009 season, Restrepo returned to lead his team back to the NCAA Championship for a third time in the last four years. The Sooners finished fourth in the Big 12 with an overall mark of 18-12 and 11-9 in league play. Sophomore Suzy Boulavsky was named to AVCA All-Central Region honorable mention. Barker and Ekwerekwu were named honorable mention All-Big 12.

The 2010 Sooners made the NCAA Tournament, marking the fourth time in the last five years OU has advanced to the postseason. Oklahoma was awarded its first-ever first and second round host site. The season was highlighted with a 21-10 overall mark and third-place finish in conference play at 13-7. Freshman Sallie McLaurin became the first Oklahoma player to be named Big 12 Freshman of the Year and was the fifth named to the all-freshman team. Barker and Boulavsky were also named to the All-Big 12 first team. Boulavsky also became the program's first Academic All-American after being named to the ESPN/College Sports Information Directors of America third team.

Restrepo was named the fourth head coach in OU volleyball history on January 26, 2004. During the search process, OU Athletics Director Joe Castiglione was set on making a program-changing hire that fit perfectly into the values of the university.

A former NCAA Division I All-American at East Stroudsburg, Restrepo was also a four-time all-conference selection. He earned team Most Valuable Player honors all four years and was the co-winner of the Senior Athlete Award in 1986. He was inducted into the East Stroudsburg Hall of Fame in 2004.

Following his collegiate career, Restrepo played one season professionally in France and returned to the United States where he played on the American Volleyball Players Pro Beach Tour.

He earned a 3A player rating on the AVP tour and had the opportunity to play against some of the giants of professional beach volleyball, including Karch Kiraly, Sinjin Smith, Randy Stoklos and Kent Steffes.

Highly involved in the international circuit and USA Volleyball, Restrepo served as co-head coach of one of two USA Volleyball under-22 select teams that toured Argentina in June 2005 and 2006.

Restrepo and his wife, the former Heidi Nichols, have two sons, Diego Ignacio and Javier Santiago.
