GASSO REACHES 800 WINS MILESTONE

Oklahoma head coach **Patty Gasso** won her 800th Division I game on March 19 against then-No. 4 Washington. Gasso is 817-267-2 (.752) in 17 years at OU. Gasso is the 20th active coach to reach the mark and 30th all-time at the NCAA Division I level. Gasso is 979-326-2 (.749) in 21 seasons as a head coach. She needs 21 wins for career win No. 1,000.

SHULTS MISSES REGIONAL, SUPER REGIONAL

Oklahoma sophomore **Jessica Shults** has missed the 2011 postseason thus far with an illness and is listed as day-to-day. Shults' 19 home runs are a single-season best for the sophomore. The OU single season record is 20 (Lisa Carey, 2000 and Lynette Velazquez, 1999).

SOONERS SWEEP WILDCATS TO RETURN TO WCWS

Oklahoma got a brilliant performance from **Keilani Ricketts** and the top of the order drove in all five runs as the Sooners downed Arizona, 5-2, for a second straight day. With the win Oklahoma advances to its sixth Women's College World Series and first since 2004. Ricketts got it done with the bat, driving in OU's first two runs via a home run. She also drew a walk later in the game. In the circle, she threw her second complete game in as many days, holding Arizona to two earned runs on seven hits.

TWO-OUT RALLIES AID IN SHUT OUT OF ARIZONA

Oklahoma scored four of its six runs with two outs as the Sooners shut out the Arizona Wildcats 6-0 on May 27 at Hillenbrand Stadium. Oklahoma starter **Keilani Ricketts** went the distance for the 30th time this year and threw her 23rd career shutout in the win. Ricketts allowed seven hits and two walks while striking out 13.

OKLAHOMA WINS 10TH NCAAW REGIONAL TITLE

Oklahoma won its 10th NCAA Regional title to advance to the Super Regionals by defeating Iona and Tulsa twice. The Sooners previously won regional championships from 2000-05, 2007-08 and 2010.

FOUR SOONERS EARN NFCA ALL-REGION HONORS

Four Oklahoma softball student-athletes were named to the Louisville Slugger/National Fastpitch Coaches Association Division I All-Central Region team. Sophomores **Keilani Ricketts** and **Jessica Shults** and freshmen **Destinee Martinez** and **Brittany Williams** all earned first team honors. It is the second consecutive first team honor for Ricketts and Shults who each earned All-America status last year.

RICKETTS SETS SINGLE GAME STRIKEOUT RECORD

Already the owner of the Oklahoma single season strikeout record, Keilani Ricketts brought down another Oklahoma milestone May 20 with 19 strikeouts against Iona. It's the most strikeouts in a game by a Sooner pitcher, surpassing the previous record of 18 set by Brea Moore against Utah on April 2, 1995.

SIX SOONERS EARN ALL-BIG 12 HONORS

Six softball student-athletes have earned All-Big 12 honors as voted on by the league's coaches the conference office announced May 17. Senior **Chana'e Jones**, sophomore **Keilani Ricketts** and freshman **Destinee Martinez** were named to the first team, while seniors **Dani Dobbs** and **Haley Nix** and sophomore **Jessica Shults** earned second team honors. Ricketts earned first team honors for a second straight year, while Shults and Jones earned their second career All-Big 12 selection.

SOONERS NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-BIG 12

Dani Dobbs, **Chana'e Jones** and **Michelle Gascoigne** were named to the 2011 Academic All-Big 12 softball team on May 12. It is Dobbs' third consecutive first team honor and the first honor for Gascoigne and Jones. Earlier this month, Dobbs was named to the College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District 6 second team.

RICKETTS MOVING UP CAREER CHARTS

Keilani Ricketts (789) has moved past Kami Keiter (733) on the Oklahoma career strikeouts list. The sophomore needs just 16 strikeouts to tie Jill Most for the career record (805). Ricketts is tied for fifth in winning percentage (.726), seventh in complete games (60); eighth in innings pitched (532.0), games started (78), victories (61) and shutouts (23); and ninth in appearances (96).

SOONERS SETTING BIG 12 SINGLE SEASON RECORDS

Four Sooners have broken into the top 10 on the Big 12 single season records list. **Jessica Shults**' 19 home runs are eighth, **Brittany Williams**' 47 walks drawn are tied for sixth, **Destinee Martinez**' 222 at-bats are tied for third, and **Keilani Ricketts**' 443 strikeouts are also sixth. Ricketts' 181 strikeouts in conference play are the fourth most in a single season, trailing only Cat Osterman.

RICKETTS SETS OKLAHOMA SINGLE SEASON STRIKEOUT RECORD

Keilani Ricketts became the Oklahoma single season leader in strikeouts on April 30, breaking a 15-year old record. Jill Most (356) set the previous single season record in 1996.

PITCHING STAFF SETS SINGLE SEASON RECORD

The Oklahoma pitching staff has combined for 577 strikeouts this year, surpassing the previous single season record of 486 set in 1997. OU set a single season record with 8.40 strikeouts per seven innings last year and average 10.23 this year.

RICKETTS SITTING THEM DOWN IN DOUBLES

In 40 starts in the circle, **Keilani Ricketts** has double-digit strikeouts in 25 games.

WILLIAMS CLOSING IN ON SINGLE SEASON WALKS RECORD

Freshman **Brittany Williams** leads the Sooners and Big 12 with 47 walks drawn this season. She also leads the team with a .490 on-base percentage. The only other Sooner to have more walks in a single season was Flores (49, 2009).

ONE-RUN WINS HARD TO COME BY

Oklahoma is 5-9 in one-run games this year. OU has been out-scored 37-33 in those games and eight of those contests were against ranked opponents (3-5).

ALLEE ALLEN GETTING AT-BATS

Allee Allen recorded her first career collegiate at-bat against Cal State Bakersfield on Feb. 10. Allen drew a walk after fouling off several pitches. Since then, Allen has more plate appearances. She was hit by a pitch against Cal Poly and reached on a passed ball at North Texas. She got two at-bats in the Texas series and recorded her first career hit and RBI on May 5 against North Texas. She made her first career start at designated player on May 20 vs. Iona.

RICKETTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Oklahoma sophomore **Keilani Ricketts** was named the National Fastpitch Coaches Association National Player of the Week and Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the Week for her performances May 2-8 against North Texas and Iowa State. Ricketts went 3-0 over 13.0 innings with a 0.00 ERA, gave up two singles and 22 strikeouts. At the plate, she went 3-for-5 with four RBIs, four runs, four walks and a home run. The San Jose, Calif., native limited opponents to a .049 batting average last week, while herself turning in a .600 clip to go along with a .778 on-base percentage and a 1.200 slugging percentage. Her best showing of the week came in her team's regular-season finale against Iowa State when she turned in a two-hit complete game and struck out 14. Ricketts is the seventh Sooner to earn National Player of the Week honors from the NFCA. It is her fifth career Big 12 honor and second this season.

SOONERS DOMINATE IN SWEEP OF IOWA STATE

OU shut out Iowa State 13-0 in five innings on May 7. Oklahoma's pitching staff was perfect for 4.2 innings and held the Cyclones to just one hit. On May 8, Haley Nix and Dani Dobbs combined for a 4-for-6 showing with each scoring one run.

OKLAHOMA COMPLETES SWEEP OF NORTH TEXAS

Keilani Ricketts pitched three hitless innings and blasted a three-run home run as Oklahoma run-ruled North Texas 9-1 in five innings on May 5. Ricketts also drew two walks on the night.

SOONERS FIRST TO KNOCK OFF TEXAS

Keilani Ricketts added clutch offense to her record pitching performance to help the Sooners end the Texas' nine-game winning streak April 30 in Austin. Ricketts roped the deciding two-RBI single in the top of the third as Oklahoma defeated Texas 5-2. It was OU's first win in Austin since 2007. Texas got even with Oklahoma, defeating the Sooners 5-3 on May 1.

OKLAHOMA DROPS 2-1 GAME AT OKLAHOMA STATE

Oklahoma fell behind at Oklahoma State and was unable to mount a comeback as the Sooners dropped a 2-1 decision to the Cowgirls on April 27. The loss was just Oklahoma's third in 13 series meetings in Stillwater and the fourth in the last 36 series contests. **Keilani Ricketts** allowed the two earned runs on three hits and one walk. Ricketts struck out 13.

SOONERS SHUT OUT IN BACK-TO-BACK CONFERENCE GAMES

For the first time in the Big 12 era, Oklahoma was shut out in back-to-back conference games on April 17 at Missouri (1-0 in 11) and April 22 vs. Texas A&M (3-0).

EXTRA INNINGS GIVES MISSOURI SWEEP OF OKLAHOMA

Abby Vock hit a walk-off solo home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as Missouri downed Oklahoma 3-2 on April 16. The pitcher's duel last two hours and 36 minutes as the two teams combined for five runs on 16 hits. Nicole Hudson drove in Vock on an RBI single in the bottom of the 11th the Tigers got a second straight extra-inning win over OU on April 17, 1-0.

RICKETTS, HOME RUNS POWER SOONERS PAST OSU

Oklahoma got an impressive performance from **Keilani Ricketts** as the Sooners downed 19th-ranked Oklahoma State 5-1 on April 13. OU scored its five runs on three home runs – two-run shots from Ricketts and **Brittany Williams** and a solo shot from **Jessica Shults** to win its 14th straight over the Cowgirls in Norman.

SHULTS, RICKETTS NAMED TO TOP 25 LIST

Keilani Ricketts and **Jessica Shults** were named to USA Softball's top 25 list for its Collegiate Player of the Year award. The list represents 17 schools across six NCAA Division I conferences.

OU COMES FROM BEHIND TO DOWN BAYLOR, FALLS IN GAME TWO

Down to its final two outs, the OU softball team rallied to score three runs and defeat Baylor 3-2 on April 9. **Destinee Martinez**'s only hit of the day came in the seventh, scoring **Chana'e Jones** and **Javen Henson** to tie the game. With runners at the corners, **Jessica Shults**' sacrifice line drive to center field scored **Brianna Turang** to give OU the 3-2 victory. After taking a 2-1 lead in the bottom of the fifth, OU was unable to maintain it as the Sooners fell to Baylor 5-2 on April 10.

SOONERS SWEEP KANSAS IN LAWRENCE

OU swept Kansas April 6 in a doubleheader. OU won the first game 12-6 and the second 13-5. **Keilani Ricketts** held the Jayhawks scoreless in 5.1 innings pitched. She allowed just one hit and two walks and struck out 10 in the first game. Ricketts added a three-run home run.

OU pounded out 20 hits in the second game and got a grand slam from Ricketts and a solo home run from **Dani Dobbs**. Dobbs went a perfect five-for-five at the plate during the game. She's the first Sooner to have five or more hits in a game since Amber Flores had five against Iowa State in 2009. It's also an OU single game record.

SOONERS SPLIT SERIES WITH TEXAS TECH

Oklahoma split its series with Texas Tech April 1-2 in Lubbock. The Red Raiders took Friday night's game 5-0 and OU held on to win 7-6 on Saturday. TTU's win in the first game was the first win against OU in Lubbock for Tech. OU scored six runs in the first inning of the second game on Saturday. The Sooners hit three home runs in the game – a three-run shot from **Haley Nix**, a two-run home run from **Keilani Ricketts** and a solo shot from **Chana'e Jones**.

VANDEVER HITS FIRST CAREER HOME RUN

Freshman **Ali Vandever** hit her first career home run against Central Arkansas on March 29. Vandever's three-run shot helped secure an 8-3 win for the Sooners.

SOONERS SPLIT WITH CORNHUSKERS TO OPEN BIG 12 PLAY

Oklahoma split its conference-opening series with Nebraska on March 26-27. The Cornhuskers took the first game 4-1, while the Sooners rebounded to win 6-3 in the second game. **Keilani Ricketts** threw both games for OU and **Jessica Shults** hit two home runs in the second game to propel OU to the win.

DOBBS NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior **Dani Dobbs** was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on March 22. It is her first career Big 12 honor. Dobbs helped lead Oklahoma to a 4-2 record at the Judi Garman Classic with wins over DePaul, Pacific, No. 7 Arizona and No. 4 Washington. She hit .526 on the week (10-for-19) with five runs scored and 10 RBI. Dobbs recorded two doubles and three home runs for a 1.105 slugging percentage and totaled 21 bases in six games. She drew one walk and registered no strikeouts for a .550 on-base percentage. Dobbs was clutch for the Sooners, hitting .500 on the week with two outs and runners in scoring position (4-for-8). She also advanced 12 runners in 17 tries for a .706 percentage. Dobbs also recorded her first career grand slam against Pacific on March 18 and recorded a career-high five RBI in the game.

RICKETTS' SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED

Sophomore **Keilani Ricketts** had her scoreless inning streak snapped against Notre Dame on March 16. Ricketts had not allowed a single run in over 45.1 innings.

SOONERS WIN OKLAHOMA SPRING FESTIVAL

OU went 5-0 on the week with wins over Tulsa, Indiana, UAPB and Missouri State (twice). Four of the five wins were run rules as the Sooners won the Oklahoma Spring Festival. **Haley Nix** hit .500 (7-for-14) with six runs scored and 11 RBI on the week. In the Oklahoma Spring Festival championship game against Missouri State, she led the Sooners with five RBI, including a walk-off grand slam. **Keilani Ricketts** went 3-0 on the week with three starts and three complete game shutouts. She extended her scoreless innings streak to 42.2 innings and threw a complete game shutdown in her last six starts.

OKLAHOMA SWEEPS COMPETITION AT THE PREVIEW

OU won both games in The Preview featuring Bedlam at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium on March 5. **Keilani Ricketts** struck out 13 and **Jessica Shults** drove in five runs as the Sooners scored five runs in the first two innings to down archrival Oklahoma State 7-0. The Sooners trailed 3-2 through five innings and got a three-run home run from Shults in the bottom of the sixth to down UIC 5-3.

SOONERS STRUGGLE AT CATHEDRAL CITY CLASSIC

OU went 1-4 at the Cathedral City Classic, falling to No. 1 Georgia, No. 2 UCLA, No. 10 Hawaii and Long Beach State. OU defeated Cal Poly 4-2 on Sunday.

OU SHUTS DOWN OPPONENTS AT TROY COX CLASSIC

The Sooners went 5-0 at the Troy Cox Classic in Las Cruces, N.M. OU defeated Southern Utah, ULM, Sam Houston State and the host school – New Mexico State twice. **Brittany Williams** led the Sooners with a .500 batting average (6-for-12). She recorded her first career grand slam and had eight RBI and a 1.417 slugging percentage on the weekend. She drew a team-best five walks and was hit by a pitch three times to post a .700 on-base percentage.

Now in her 17th season at the University of Oklahoma, head coach Patty Gasso has molded the OU softball program into a national power and permanently placed herself among the elite college softball coaches in the country.

Currently in her 21st season as a head coach, Gasso has a career collegiate coaching record of 979-326-2 (.749) and holds an overall record of 817-267-2 (.752) at the University of Oklahoma. She has won more Big 12 games (209-72) than any coach in the league's history and has twice as many wins as any other coach in OU history. Gasso's Sooner teams have finished second or higher 12 different times since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996. They have won 74 percent of their Big 12 contests and OU has claimed four Big 12 regular season and four championship titles under her direction.

Numerous Sooner players have prospered under Gasso's tutelage and garnered national, regional and conference recognition. She has directed 36 All-Americans, 84 All-Region honorees and 113 all-conference selections.

In the Big 12 era, seven Sooners have been named Big 12 Player of the Year, two have been selected as Big 12 Freshman of the Year, one as Big 12 Newcomer and Lauren Eckermann was named OU's first Big 12 Pitcher of the Year in 2007. In 2010, Amber Flores became the first player in league history to earn Player of the Year honors twice.

In addition, 2005 graduate Heather Scaglione was a two-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year. Savannah Long became the first infielder to earn the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year honor in 2008. Lindsey Vandever earned the award in 2010.

The OU softball success under Gasso has also spilled over into the classroom where the Sooners have been honored with 81 academic all-conference honors. Six of those have gone on to become Academic All-Americans, including Lana Moran, the 2000 Academic All-American of the Year.

Gasso and her staff have consistently been recognized for their efforts on and off the field. The staff was awarded three consecutive Speedline/NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards from 1999-2001 and received the national honor in 2000. Gasso and staff have claimed the Midwest honor in five of their 15 seasons with the most recent award coming in 2004. In addition, Gasso has been named the Big 12 and Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1996, 1999 and 2000. She is a four-time Big 12 Coach of the Year.
